Quick Guide

Refer to Resident Application instructions at <http://ndsr-pma.arlisna.org/info-for-residents> for complete details about eligibility and the application process. Applicants should compile the application and supporting documents and submit them in one e-mail to ndsr@philamuseum.org with the subject line “[Your Name] NDSR Art Application” by **5:00 p.m. on March 17, 2017.**

1. Eligibility—Applicants must have received a master’s degree (or higher) within two years of the residency start date in a field related to the stewardship of digital art information. If you are receiving your degree after the application deadline, and are selected as a NDSR Art resident, you will need to sign an agreement confirming you will receive your degree prior to the residency start in August 2017 or will relinquish your place in the program.
2. Cover letter—The cover letter should provide a clear statement of goals and demonstrate a strong understanding of or interest in digital preservation and the arts as a profession. It should also discuss relevant leadership and work experiences.
3. Resume/Curriculum Vitae—The curriculum vitae should contain a summary of your employment history, qualifications, and education.
4. Video or online project (optional) — The video or online project should answer the question, “Why are you interested in the digital stewardship of art information?” The video piece does not need to be technically perfect or professionally edited, but it should show your ability to communicate through spoken language, audio and/or audiovisual recordings, or other means. It should not take us more than five minutes to view. The main point is to convince a viewer of your interest in the project and goals of NDSR Art. The NDSR Art program may ask those accepted to the program to allow their videos or online projects to be posted publicly, so you should have the rights to use any embedded material or cite your sources properly under fair use. Include the URL of your video or online project on Page 2 of this application if it’s accessible online. Otherwise, email a zip file to ndsr@philamuseum.org with your name and ‘Video/Online Project’ in the subject line.
5. Two Reference letters—References should e-mail their letters to ndsr@philamuseum.org from their own e-mail accounts with your name and “Reference Letter” in the subject line.
